## *Variety of Outfits*

Despite where you are shopping, you will want to have a variety of outfits. You don't want them all to be dresses or outfits with jeans. You will want to change it up. The same goes for your color scheme. If you already have one or two white tops, make sure you're mixing it up. Even if your dress and tops look different but are both predominantly white, they may look the same on-camera for close up shots making it look like you only brought one outfit.





## *Accessories*

One of the things that people often overlook in their wardrobe is making sure that they are accessorizing properly! This not only helps your photographer when posing, but it also brings your overall look together perfectly. Things like sunglasses, hats, bracelets, necklaces, jackets and anything that will help layer your base outfit. Remember, most of your photos will be half body or close up shots and so things like accessories are really important!

## *Skin Tone*

When you're shopping, you will want to make sure that you're picking color tones that are perfect for your skin tone. If not, you risk your photos not looking absolutely perfect. Certain skin tones pair well with different colored outfits. I recommend that my clients think about this when shopping for their outfits to make sure their photos pop and are vibrant.

Make sure to ask your photographer prior to booking what resources they offer for getting you prepped for your session. At AGP we offer a full What to Wear Guide, so your outfits will be perfect!





## *Go All Out!*

Something that I can't stress enough is that you should go all out for your outfits! What I mean is that something that might be a really cute outfit in person, might not look good on camera at all...

I usually tell my senior clients to avoid white crop or tube tops, outfits with no color or outfits where you'll be restricted when posing in. You will be sitting, standing, squatting, walking and more during your senior session so make sure your wardrobe will accommodate that!

## *Have Some Fun!*

After all these are your senior portraits, so it's important to capture who you are in this moment! Don't be afraid to wear a trendy outfit, or something a little more bold. Maybe not for every outfit, but it's ok to have fun with one!

Your senior portraits should be a fun experience, leaving you on cloud 9. Make sure you choose the right senior photographer for you!
